The Heart Gallery concept began in New Mexico and soon spread to several other states. New Jersey is the site of the largest project yet. In 2005, we photographed 346 foster children. Two years later, more than 100 have been adopted. This year, "100 Waiting Children" focuses on New Jersey's foster children who have been in the foster care system the longest and are in need of finding a permanent home before they "age out" of the foster care system.

DID YOU KNOW?

- In 2004, more than half a million children and youth were in the U.S. foster care system.
- Half of all children in foster care are over the age of ten.
- Each year, 20,000 teenagers "age out," leaving the system without finding a permanent adoptive family.
- More than 100 children from the Heart Gallery of New Jersey 2005 exhibit have been placed in permanent homes.
- New Jersey has 1,740 foster children available for adoption nationwide.
- There is no charge by the Division of Youth and Family Services (DYFS) to adopt. Payment of legal fees is one of the benefits offered through adoption subsidy, so many families adopting children through DYFS will have that cost covered for them.
- DYFS helps families through the process of becoming licensed foster or adoptive parents, which involves getting references, background checks, training, interviews and home inspections.
- Families who adopt children who are difficult to place or have special needs are eligible to receive monthly subsidies, medical coverage and assistance with child care and other services.
